

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Monday 12th St Jane Frances de Chantal

was born in Dijon in 1572 and was married with six children. After the death of her husband, she entered religious life and founded the Visitation Order. She died in 1641.

Tuesday 13th Saints Pontian and Hippolytus:

Pontian, the Pope, and Hippolytus, a priest, had disagreed on matters of Church Law, but were eventually reconciled to each other when they were both exiled to the mines of Sardinia in 235; they died there, and their bodies were returned to Rome, where their cult began in the forth century.

Wednesday 14th Saint Maximilian Mary Kolbe:

born in Poland in 1894, he became a Franciscan in 1910. Arrested by the invading German forces in 1939 and sentenced to heavy labour in the extermination camp at Auschwitz, when a married man was chosen to be executed, Maxi-milian volunteered to take his place: he was killed by lethal injection on 14 August 1941. He was canonised in 1982 in the presence of the man whose life he saved.

Friday 16th St. Stephen,

crowned as King of Hungary in 1000, was just, peaceful and religious, and dedicated to spreading Christianity in his realm. He died in 1038.
